Do we have the people available to answer learner questions about accessing courses on mobile devices?	
How well do does our team collaborate with the IT folks (or other technical team members), who may end up lending a hand in supporting learners with mobile devices?	
Who will own support of e-learning on mobile devices?	
Will we open up access to e-learning on learner-owned devices or will we require learners to access courses from company-owned devices?	



What information security barriers or concerns do we need to address or overcome, if any?	
If we expect learners to access content from their own devices, using cellular data plans, will they be compensated/reimbursed for that expense? How will those policies be communicated?	
How will we continuously communicate our expectations for accessing learning content on mobile devices?
